


Sentence

The puzzle pieces do not make sense, right?


Now, let's put on our thinking caps and re-arrange the pieces together to make sense.



A Sentence is a group of words that make complete sense.

Subject and Predicate

A sentence is always made up of two parts.





The Subject is the one we're talking about in the sentence. It can be a person, a place or a thing.

The Predicate is the action part of the sentence. It tells us what the subject is doing or what's happening to the subject. It always includes the verb.

Phrase

A Phrase is a group of words that is a part of a sentence which conveys some sense but not complete sense.

Examples:

For her family, is sleeping peacefully, barked loudly
