Parts of Speech

In English, words are grouped into different categories or classes based on how they are used in a sentence. These categories are called 'Parts of Speech.' There are mainly eight parts of speech, as listed below:

Noun

Read the following words:

• Chennai, fruit, house, bravery, freedom, knowledge, family, water, sugar.

All the words mentioned represent people, places, things or ideas.

NOUN is a word that denotes the name of a person, place, animal, thing or an idea / emotion.

e.g. Micheal and his **cat** went to the **park.** *(person) (animal) (place)*

Pronoun

Read the following words:

• he, she, we, they, us, who, which, me, myself, themselves, I, that, this, those, these, it. All the words mentioned can be used in place of a noun to avoid repetition.

PRONOUN is a word used in place of a noun.

e.g. Alex has a bicycle and **he** rides **it** to work every day.

(Alex) (bike)

Adjective

Read the following words:

• clever, loud, beautiful, long, thick, many, two, fat, thick, wide.

All the words mentioned describe or modify a noun, giving more information about its quality, appearance or characteristics.

ADJECTIVE is a word that describes, qualifies or quantifies a noun or a pronoun.

e.g. The **curious** child collected **seven** seashells on the beach. *(describes) (quantifies)*

Verb

Read the following words:

• run, write (action) • have, belong (possession) • is, am, are, was (state of being)

All the words mentioned express an action, occurrence or state of being in a sentence.

VERB is a word that shows action, possession or state of being.

- **e.g.** Sneha likes to **paint** in her free time. *(action)*
- ♦ She **is** a talented musician. (state of being)
- ♦ She **holds** the key to the treasure chest. (*possession*)

Adverb

Read the following words:

• quickly, happily, rarely, never, often, sometimes, always, sadly, continuously.

All the above mentioned words provide information about how, when, where or to what extent an action or quality occurs.

ADVERB is a word that adds to the meaning of a verb, adjective or another adverb.

- **e.g.** ◆ The students eagerly **waited** for the test results. (*waited how?*)
 - ♦ The train will depart **soon.** (will depart when?)
 - ♦ The kids played **outside** in the backyard. (played where?)



Preposition

Read the following words:

• on, in, from, to, with, among, under, behind, through, about, up, down.

All the above mentioned words show the relationship between a noun (or pronoun) and another word in the sentence, indicating location, time, direction or manner.

PREPOSITION is a word which shows the relation between a noun or a pronoun and some other word(s) in a sentence.

- **e.g.** The plane flew **over** the mountains. (*over* shows the relation between *the plane* and *the mountain*)
 - Vinay ran **towards** the finish line. (towards shows the relation between Vinay and the finish line)

Conjunction

Read the following words:

• and, but, or, yet, so, not only...but also, because, wherever, so that, when, where.

All the above mentioned words connect words, phrases, or clauses together to show relationships, such as joining similar ideas (and), contrasting ideas (but) or indicating cause and effect (because).

CONJUNCTION is a word used to join words, clauses or sentences.

- e.g. \(\phi\) He is both talented **and** hardworking. (and joins the words talented and hardworking)
 - He studied hard for the exam, **but** he didn't perform well. (but connects two sentences)

Interjection

Read the following words:

• Ah!, Bravo!, Alas!, Hurrah!, Wow!, Oops!, Lo!

All the above mentioned words express strong emotions, feelings, or sudden reactions in a sentence.

INTERJECTION is a word that expresses a sudden feeling.

e.g. • Hurray! We are going on vacation.

Ouch! That hurt.
